The child and his dog

It is a short piece of music called program music since it represents a scene. It can therefore be analyzed and listened to like a short ballet.

On the technical level, I tried to merge the classical technique with that of "Rag-time" and to enrich as much as possible by often changing tones (the main ones being A and E) and especially modes (major, neutral, minor., - minor). So there are no repeats.
