Born in the neighborhood of Paris in 1943, Gilbert Bonora, the son of an Italian father and a French mother, has always harbored the twin passions of painting and music.

« Gilbert Bonora's works are shrouded in an atmosphere of intriguing mystery. They are suffused with an underlying sense of the existence of undisclosed treasures laden with history. Both in his watercolors and oil paintings, one can see a solidly constructed reality mixed with imaginary visions, a combination from which emanates something unreal and quite unwanted that immediately catches the soul of the onlooker. »
