Electric Guitar

Guitar

Measures 1-3 of the score. The Electric Guitar part (top staff) has rests in measures 1 and 2, followed by a melodic line in measure 3. The Guitar part (bottom staff) plays a rhythmic accompaniment of chords and single notes.
