Organ

The first system of the piece, measures 1-4. The music is in 2/4 time with a key signature of one sharp (F#). The right hand features a melody of eighth and quarter notes, while the left hand plays a steady eighth-note accompaniment. Measure 4 ends with a fermata over the final note.
