After being diagnosed with juvenile myelomonocytic leukemia, a cancer where one out of one million children is affected, Caitie was given treatment at a hospital in Singapore where she managed to stay calm and to smile often as depicted in her photos until her death on one Thursday morning. Hence, Courageous Caitie has become an inspiration to thousands of Filipinos and other nationalities who were aware of her condition.
