Andrés Segovia E Major Scale

This E Major scale has only two positions: VI and IX. The circled numbers are the string numbers you should pluck. Once a string number is shown, continue playing notes on that string until the string number changes to a different string.

Purpose: To familiarize you with notes located in different positions of the fretboard so that you will know where the notes are in the higher register of the guitar fretboard. While this scale doesn't cover all notes, you can use these notes as reference points to locate others.

Home work: Play this scale over and over until you have memorized it and the new note locations on the guitar fretboard.
