Harpsichord

The first system of music shows measures 1 through 4. It is written for Harpsichord in G major (one sharp) and 6/8 time. The right hand features a melodic line with eighth and sixteenth notes, while the left hand provides a rhythmic accompaniment with eighth notes and rests.
