EPILOGUE

I composed *Spring Dances* Suite in 1999, when I was a first year student, and performed it as the last concert repertoire number in my Graduation Exam. The recording of the concert may be found in the Archives of the „Gheorghe Dima” Academy of Music in Cluj Napoca.

Although I composed numerous guitar parts – with the thought of publishing them once - I feel that this is my most important creation and it will be remain so because I feel that it is unlikely that I will ever compose again.

At first the Suite consisted of only three parts, the First and the Last one were added in 2002, then it was thrown into the depth of a drawer. After more than ten years I found it and played it. Then I decided to modify it a little, give it a form and publish it in an unconventional way: I registered it at the Romanian Union of Musicians and Composers, then I put it on the Internet, free of charge, because the most important thing for me is to let the world have access to it and who considers it worthy may even play it, without any interdiction. I found this way the most suitable one, as the Internet is an unpredictable world and no publishing house can compete with its ability to disseminate information,

I would like to thank all those who helped me, but, first of all, thanks to my family for the patience and understanding that they showed during all this time.

I wish to add the fact that this is a music born from the instinct, notes reflect feelings, thoughts which guided me at the turn of the millennium and which have faded, changed and disappeared in me since then.

That is why I sadly have to admit that, in some ways, I have become a little bit poorer.
